RATIONALE

Since Prehistory that the sky was always been integrated as part of the cosmovision of human societies. The sky played a fundamental role not only in the space orientation, in the time organization, in the ritual practices or in the celestial divination but also as an element of power.

Migrations and voyages are intrinsic to the humankind, they opened the routes for cultural diffusion and trade, but also for power dominance. Following their routes is also to follow their cultural diversity and how they met or clashed. The sky and astronomical phenomena provided the tools for time reckoning, calendar organization and celestial navigation that supported those voyages. Astronomy gives us today the capacity to reproduce the sky, opening a window through which we can glimpse how those societies perceived, integrated and manipulated the sky into their world views and their myths, and, ultimately, into their society organization.

A voyage is always a meeting of different worlds and a process to accept diversity. We wish that this Conference will be also a meeting of different worlds in the invited lectures, in the public lectures, in the LOC/SOC and in the audience.

The main conference topics are:

- Techniques of celestial navigation and orientation of the past. Astronomical navigation and nautical instruments in XIV, XV and XVI centuries.
- Expressions of astronomical knowledge in architecture and monuments, rock art, archaeology and landscape. People migration, a meeting between different cultures
- History of astronomy. A meeting between different conceptions
- Astronomy and the Jesuits. A meeting between different worlds
- Astronomy in antiquity. A meeting between different knowledges
- Ethno-astronomy, Cultural Astronomy and myths, voyages in space and in time through different cultures.
- To where is Archaeoastronomy voyaging? A round table about Archaeoastronomy, Cultural Astronomy and Education

We will challenge the speakers to start their lectures as a voyage history, presenting different perspectives:

- an history from a discovery or excavation,
- a voyage through cultures,
- a meeting between cultures.

VENUE

SEAC 2011 takes place in Évora, Portugal. It will be hosted by the History department of Évora University and will take place in the University Auditorium.

Évora and its University offer a unique setting for a SEAC conference. The Évora district is one of the richest areas of megalithic Iberia and has been systematically studied by archaeoastronomers in recent years. The University of Évora occupies the former building of the only Portuguese Jesuit University and has auditoriums for more than 100 participants. Évora is also linked to Lisbon by public transportation systems (Bus and Train).

This museum-city, whose roots go back to Roman times, reached its golden age in the 15th century, when it became the residence of the Portuguese kings. Its unique quality stems from the whitewashed houses decorated with azulejos and wrought-iron balconies dating from the 16th to the 18th century. Its monuments had a profound influence on Portuguese architecture in Brazil (source: http://whc.unesco.org/en/list/361).

SEAC 2011 will be integrated in the 25th anniversary celebration of Évora being in the UNESCO World Heritage list.

CONFERENCE PROCEEDINGS

We will publish a volume of the contributions having about 300-320 pages. The volume includes the preface, the invited lectures, the normal contributions, the posters, and a subject index, too. Important: All contributions are going through the peer review process.

GRANTS AND ACCOMMODATION AIDS

There are a few grants. Additionally we are trying to arrange some possibilities of free accommodation. These aids will be preferably assigned to young postdocs and PhD students. Those wishing to get such an aid should send their abstract and the grant application form till March, 15th to the chairpersons of the LOC:

Eligibility: the applicant either must be a postgraduate student working on a Masters or PhD degree with a subject on some aspect of astronomy in culture or must have completed such a degree no earlier than 2008. The grant may be shared by two or more authors of the same paper.

Application requirements: 1) An extended abstract with bibliography of the paper to be presented (i.e. 1500 words not including the bibliography). 2) A curriculum vitae. 3) A reference from the applicant's advisor.

You will be informed till May 1st, 2011 whether your application has been accepted.

PRESENTATIONS, LECTURES, ROUND TABLE DISCUSSION

The conference will consist of invited talks, oral presentations, and posters. Invited talks are fixed to 30 minutes (25 minutes for the talk + 5 minutes for the discussion). These contributions on special topics will be given from speakers invited by the organisers. Oral presentations are limited to 20 minutes (17 + 3).

A special poster session will be held. Like the oral presentations, posters will only be accepted for presentation at the conference if the author is personally present. In case that there are too many applications for oral presentations, the LOC will decide which ones should instead be presented as posters. Posters are no "second class" presentations! Posters which have been accepted for publication in the conference proceedings will get the same number of pages as the oral presentations. Posters can be sized up to 1 page following the ISO 126 (A0: 841 x 1189 mm or 33.1 x 46.8 in.)

Two public lectures and one round table discussions are planned.

REGISTRATION

The **registration fee** for regular participants will be 270€ (plus 100€ per each accompanying persons). It includes the abstract book, the printed volume of the conference proceedings, the welcome-reception, 9 coffee-breaks, the closing dinner, and the half-day excursion. For accompanying persons, the fee includes the welcome reception, the closing dinner and the half-day excursion. The deadline for regular registration is July 1st, 2011.

The registration fee for students will be 80€. It includes the abstract book, the conference proceedings in CD format and 9 coffee-breaks. The deadline for regular registration is September 1st, 2011.

Cancellation policy:

If you cancel your registration till July 31, 2011, the fee will be refunded completely (minus 10,-€ for money transfer and administration costs).

Cancellation till September 1, 2011: 125,-€ will be refunded (accompanying person: 50,-€).

Cancellation after September 1, 2011: There is no refunding of fees possible.

Deadline for paying the regular registration fee: July 1, 2011.

Deadline for paying the student registration fee: September 15, 2011.

The exact program and the costs for the two day excursion at September 24-25 are still under negotiation.

LODGING

The organization will not take care of lodging! A list of recommended facilities is indicated by the LOC at the website and the delegates are expected to make the appropriate reservations for themselves and at their own responsibility.

Since Évora is a touristic destination, the accommodations are highly coveted, particularly during Summer and beginning of Autumn. Therefore we made special arrangements to keep a pre-reserved number of rooms in the recommended facilities offered in the webpage. Please consider booking your room as soon as possible since this pre-reserve will not be available after the indicated deadlines and it may become difficult to find a room at a convenient price after the deadline expiration.
