CONFERENCE SERIES

This conference series explores ancient cities and their surrounding micro-regions as interconnected socio-ecological systems. Rather than viewing urban and rural spaces in isolation or hierarchy, the project emphasizes their mutual entanglement across time and place. It is guided by an international advisory board consisting of Manuel Fernández-Götz (Oxford), Elif Koparal (Istanbul), Naoise MacSweeney (Vienna), Jeroen Poblome (Leuven), Andrew Wallace-Hadrill (Cambridge) and Martin Zimmermann (Munich).

The first conference, held at the German Archaeological Institute in Madrid from 21* – 23" May 2025, focuses on configurations of city and micro-region within the ancient Mediterranean and its neighbouring regions. Particular attention will be given to socio-ecological complexity, temporal dynamics, and the ways in which these configurations were represented, perceived, and planned. The setting in Madrid offers a framework for discussing Mediterranean urbanism within a long-term perspective.

The second conference will take place at the German Archaeological Institute in Istanbul from 30° October – 1° November 2025. This event shifts the focus to issues of connection, integration, and broader global perspectives, including martime interaction and comparative approaches to city-region relations beyond the ancient Mediterranean. By concluding the series in Istanbul, the dialogue expands to encompass the diversity of urban life in the Mediterranean and beyond.
